From Our Rabbi

Our flight back home from Etz Chaim's Israel trip should have been uneventful. Sadly, it wasn't.

After waiting several hours for take-off, our plane of 400+ passengers was told that our aircraft had mechanical problems.



Chaos then ensued.

After a fabulous, flawless trip, we had to pick up our suitcases and reenter customs into Israel. United Airlines failed utterly to help anyone over the screams of hundreds of unhappy people. ITC, our travel agent, successfully scrambled to get all of us rooms in Tel Aviv and a ride back to the airport for our rescheduled flight fifteen hours later.

What was the "mechanical problem"? The next day, our flight attendant informed us that a passenger on the previous flight had chosen to flush garbage in the bathroom, clogging up the airplane's entire wastewater system (those of you who have flown before know that there is no shortage of signs asking people not to do this). The selfish actions of one individual affected an entire plane of people, including a person on our flight who was traveling to the USA with an organ in a cooler for a lifesaving organ transplant.

Call it the "Great Man Theory" of history. Label it the "Butterfly Effect". Either way the point is the same. As we slowly creep toward the Holy Days at the conclusion of summer, we are called to remember how every one of our actions affects the lives or fortunes of someone else.

This year, one megalomaniac in Russia ruined the lives of millions of people living peacefully in the Ukraine. Another unknown person chose to eat an infected bat in China leading to a worldwide pandemic. One terrible flush led to 400 people scrambling in the middle of the night to find places to sleep, more delayed flights, and quite possibly, the death of another person.

Today, we are too cavalier about what we say and what we do. Only that is not what Judaism teaches us is the way to live. In Pirkei Avot, Rabbi Yehuda HaNasi charges us to avoid making errors in judgement by remembering that "all your deeds are inscribed in a book."

As we approach the holy days - a little later than usual this year - we are called to remember that everything we do has an effect on another person, from what we choose to wear in the morning to the way we choose to eat, to the way we "purge ourselves", spiritually and physically.

None of us lives in our own personal silo. Even the smallest of our actions can affect another.

Never forget that the next time you are deciding what to do with your trash on an airplane.


But things change and "all things must pass."

Etz Chaim...Creating Meaningful Jewish Experiences
As many of you know, recently the Cobb County School
District changed the logo of Eastside Elementary School
(the elementary school across the street from our
synagogue). The new logo that was released earlier this
week is strikingly similar to a Nazi symbol. Members of



our Etz Chaim community, including Marty Gilbert, Rabba Amanda Flaks, and Stacy Efrat, were interviewed by the media. All of them articulated similar concerns about the need for deeper education and understanding about antisemitism, Holocaust symbolism, and diversity in the stakeholder evaluation process when decisions like this are made in the future.

In discussing the issues with Rabbi Dorsch, we talked about the fact that negative Jewish experiences seem to get the most traction in the media. Of course, I understand why, but I still don't like it. In response, I think we should try to flip the conversation. While we must address the negative stories and experiences by educating others, we need to create a different, alternative narrative simultaneously. I want to challenge all of us to "advertise" *creating meaningful Jewish experiences*. We are so fortunate to be part of a robust, thriving, active Jewish community with tons of events, meetings, and holidays coming up. Etz Chaim has a fabulous and growing child-centered Preschool and an equally flourishing and successful Religious School. Let's talk about the positive messages as loudly and as broadly as we address and educate about the negative messages.

Coming up in August, we have something for just about everyone! There is a Young Adult kickoff event, then a Prime Timers kickoff event, followed by a Sisterhood kickoff event. We have an ongoing Youth Department fundraiser (jars of honey for Rosh Hashanah) and we have two *Lilmode* adult education opportunities. College Connection will be collecting names and addresses of our college-age kids for small packages and notes throughout the year. Shabbat in the Park (with Men's Club grilling dinner for our members and potential new members) is smack in the middle of the month. We have the solemn commemoration of Tisha B'Av, and the joyous experiences of Shabbat. Plus our first day of Religious School and our first USY Wacky Wednesday are in August.

Woven throughout all these opportunities is the chance to participate in one of our **Roots Groups** (woodworking, yoga, walking, movie-going), be involved in our **Chesed** committee (life cycle events for our congregants), and/or participate in (or start a new) **Chavurah**. Chavurot are small groups of 20-30 congregants who get together socially outside of Etz Chaim. They communicate independently and schedule their get-togethers privately. Singles or couples are welcome to join or form a new Chavurah.

Come back home to Congregation Etz Chaim. Join us in *creating* meaningful Jewish experiences for you and your family. Let's change the narrative together.

Each Spring, as I prepare for Camp Ruach, I reflect on what the word "ruach" means - Spirit. In the beginning of Bereshit, the Torah references the Spirit of God, ruach Elohim. As June rolls around and the children enter the building ready for camp, the smell of sunscreen, little bodies in their swimsuits, and the excitement for the day fills the air. I cannot help but believe that feeling is, indeed, the spirit of God, ruach. This summer children are busy moving from activity zone to activity zone emersed in experiences related to science, art, sports, sensory, music,



and water. On any given day, one can hear children belting out their group cheers, watching with anticipation as volcanoes of baking powder and vinegar explode, creating magic wands and pet rocks, dipping their toes into oobleck and creating obstacle courses to travel through. Camp Ruach is an amazing place for preschoolers to spend their summer. Different than the school year, much of the day is spent outside visiting the designated zone areas. Each zone is run by a staff member who facilitates an experience for the children visiting the zone. And then, along with Lauren Chernau for the preschool and the boards of both schools, we present, discuss, and get ready for the next school year. Definitely not a lather, rinse, repeat scenario. It can sometimes get a little sticky with so many people involved but bringing in the teachers and board members allows another layer of ideas and opinions that fosters more growth and greater involvement. So as we move into this coming school year, look for new ideas, new activities, new faculty, parent volunteering opportunities in preschool, a different method of introducing / reinforcing Hebrew, and especially look for our 7th graders and how they are involved in the other Religious School classrooms. Also look for the reintroduction of activities that we had to put on hold due to COVID—coffee and curriculum with Debbie, grade level Shabbat dinners, and family programs. It's true, waking up early for Preschool drop off and on Sunday morning will be lather, rinse, repeat, but we anticipate the school year being nothing but good changes and lots of involvement.

From Our Director of Engagement and Youth Programming - Please welcome Leah Green

Hi, my name is Leah Green. Many of my family have been members of this congregation since the beginning of this synagogue. I've grown up here and every step I take in Etz Chaim brings a memory back from a time in my childhood. The hallway where my office is reminds me of 6th and 7th grade Hebrew School class with Mrs. Lyons. It reminds me of running down it as fast as I could, racing against my brother, Max. I also get to see other family and friends in the pictures lining the walls. I remember pretending to do plays in the library, I remember playing hide and seek in the sanctuary and the chapel. This synagogue brings me such a comforting feeling, a safe feeling.



Through college I was really interested in the human psyche. I studied psychology and economics. I joined a club called The Nudge Unit which focused on behavioral economics and how we can get people to make the right choice an easier one to make. A common example of this would be the default option which makes an option easier or harder to select. It amazed me that even a small "nudge" can help people make very important decisions for themselves. My unit focused heavily on sustainability. Since working at Etz Chaim, I've been informed about the recycling situation that exists and how the recycling works here. 

CONGREGATION ETZ CHAIM YOUTH DEPARTMENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Arrival/Dismissal

All participants are expected to arrive before the start of each program and be picked up after each program concludes. If any parent must pick up their child early, they should reach out to the Youth Director and/or Advisor(s) in a timely fashion. If any child is being picked up by an adult other than their own parent or sibling, the Youth Director must receive written notice, whether through email or a signed letter provided at drop-off. USYers of driving age are <u>not</u> allowed to drive during any program.

Behavior

All Youth Department participants are to treat each other with respect and dignity. At no time will any derogatory remarks toward one another be tolerated.

Hukei Habayit (House Rules)

With the understanding that we have different participants who are setup for success in different ways, we ask that no pets are brought into the Bayit, unless a specific activity/program asks for them. All food brought into the Etz Chaim Bayit must be marked kosher or approved by the Youth Director or Rabbi. Participants will not be allowed to leave their program unless the Advisor(s)/Youth Director deem the Bayit cleaned. In the spirit of fostering independence, we ask that Parents, unless in an official volunteer capacity, do not join us during programs.

Dress Codes

The dress code will vary from program to program. It is mandatory, however, that all those who identify as male, while in the Synagogue, wear kippot. While in the Sanctuary, everyone must have their shoulders covered. Shorts, skirts and skorts must be an appropriate length. Shirts cannot show midriff, back or cleavage and must be free of inappropriate language or insignia. Tank top straps must be two fingers in width.

Financials & Financial Assistance

While most programs that happen at Etz Chaim or the Bayit will be covered by your dues, some specialty programs (like Chocolate Seder) may incur an additional fee. All monies must be paid at the program, or in advance. Late payments may incur an additional fee. Checks are preferred and should be made out to Congregation Etz Chaim with the activity and participants name on the memo line. We believe that financial need should never stop a child from participating in any of our programs. 
