



I remember my college days teaching religious school at a reform congregation in New York. A child came to school and presented their family's "traditional" Passover dish.



With a smile, and a degree of patience, the Rabbi explained that years earlier she knew of an older, classical reform German Jewish family. Their break the fast meal on Yom Kippur included eating pork. The family had been eating this same meal for over a hundred years. She challenged me. Did a hundred years of eating the same meal make their food any "less traditional?"

It was in that moment that I discovered an inherent problem with the word "traditional": namely, how a person understands "traditional" is usually subjective and based on a person's life narrative, experiences, and inherited beliefs.

I've also seen in our time how the word "traditional" can get applied in very judgmental ways. Let's juxtapose, for example: 1. a person who attends synagogue regularly but defames people publicly against 2. A non-shul goer who is a mensch. Both shul attendance and not gossiping are important to our tradition. But how many of us would nonetheless be inclined to define the Shulgoer as "traditional" despite his or her noxious behavior?

Try another: An interfaith Jewish family that keeps a kosher home and celebrates Shabbat every week. Is this family less "traditional" than a family with two Jewish parents who chooses to not keep kosher or celebrate Shabbat at all?

You see my problem. We think there's a litmus test for the word "tradition," or like Justice Oliver Wendell Holmes famously declared, "we know it when we sees it." (For the record, yes, I know that Holmes was not writing about tradition.) But as Gershwin wrote, when it comes to tradition, "it ain't necessarily so."

That's why this year, I am going instead to begin to use a different word: "authentic".

As your Rabbi, I feel deeply blessed and proud every day to have the opportunity to work with all kinds of people who seek out a connection to Judaism that feels real and authentic.

Our synagogue has a vision for what an authentic Judaism looks and feels like: a deep commitment to Torah study, fostering a connection to God through prayer, deep engagement with the State of Israel and Hebrew language, and strong, moral character development. But often, my work involves a lot of meeting people not based on where they came from, but what they have the potential to grow to become--and helping them to develop a personal relationship with God.

We all love the song from *Fiddler*. But it may be time at long last to bury "Tradition" alongside Anatevka. Instead of tradition, let's talk about building an authentic Judaism that speaks to what makes us proud to be Jewish without being judgmental of others.

Letter from an Israeli Family Visiting our Community:

17 January 2023

Dear Rabbi Dorsch and the Congregants of Etz Chaim Synagogue,

On behalf of my daughter Rachella, and my grandchildren Adam and Ella, I would like to express our deep appreciation for the warm welcome we received at Congregation Etz Chaim during the months of November and December 2023.

We live in Northern Israel and received an invitation to take a respite from the War from our cousin Phil Greenspon. He thought a visit to Atlanta would give us a break from the tensions in Israel and assured us that the congregants of Etz Chaim would be friendly. I knew that Phil and his family would be attentive towards us, but we never imagined how loving and supportive the Etz Chaim community would be!

From the moment I notified Phil that we were coming to Atlanta, the Etz Chaim community rallied to provide us with all of our emotional and material needs, including cribs, diapers, toys and clothing for the babies. The Educational Director Debbie Deutsch accepted Adam into nursery school and all the staff did their utmost to aid in his acclimation. What could have been a traumatic situation for a little boy became a loving, educational and pleasurable experience.

The Congregants of Etz Chaim and the nursery school parents welcomed us warmly. Many people greeted us at Shabbat morning kiddush, invited us to their homes, and bestowed upon us Chanukkah gifts (many of which we are passing on to other Israeli children displaced from their homes.) Even though you had never met us before, you accepted us with love, as family.

We have returned to an Israel at war. Every day, names of fallen soldiers and slain hostages are announced. They were young people, full of promise, hopes and dreams that will never be fulfilled. The trees in my small community of Kfar Vradim are covered with yellow ribbons, hoping for the return of 23-year-old Romi Gonen. Romi, a beautiful blond, curly-headed girl, grew up in our town and is an exceptional ballet and modern dancer. She was abducted by Hamas savage terrorists from the Nova Music Festival on October 7, and for some reason was not returned in the earlier hostage exchange of women. Every citizen in Israel is affected by the war.

This war has shown us that the fate of Jews world-wide are intertwined. Whether it is in facing anti-Semitism in schools and on campuses, or missiles, terrorists and kidnappings, it is clear that we Jews have many enemies. But we also possess the ability to rally around one other. This time, my family was the beneficiary of boundless love, concern and support from the Etz Chaim Congregants. And for this, we are eternally grateful.

My family is not accustomed to being on the "receiving side." Both my daughter and I are social workers and used to providing assistance. We hope and pray that peace will once again reign in Israel, and that we will be able to welcome you in our homes in Israel.

In the meantime, may you and the Congregants and Staff of Etz Chaim be blessed with good health, sustenance, and love. May all your warmth and generosity merit you the fulfillment of all your dreams and wishes. And may you all be privileged to remain on the "giving" side of assistance.

Our different organizations, like our Affinity Groups, Education Department, Men's Club and Sisterhood, are the instrument sections, each playing its part in harmony and synchronization. Our Executive Committee are the conductors. We set the vision and ensure all parts are working together to achieve that vision. Contributions made to the Chesed Fund will help to fund these services.


