What are the values of our synagogue? The Talmud teaches that if you want to understand a person, all you have to do is to take a look at what is in his or her pocket.

With this in mind, if you want to understand the values of our synagogue, you only need take a look at how our synagogue spent our pocket change this year.

If you've come to one of our daily minyan services or been to a board meeting, then you know that at least twice a day we pass the pushke around. It's an opportunity for us to perform the mitzvah of tzedakah when we daven. When the tzedakah box makes its way around, we place in quarters, dollars, and the contents of our pockets.

What you may not know is that your dollar adds up.

As a synagogue, we must not only be a community that fundraises for our own internal needs, but one that distributes funds to important causes that represent our values. That is why from last July until this one, perhaps our largest, single donation made from our pushke fund was over two thousand dollars to Moshe Sebagabo, our contact in the Jewish community in Uganda. These funds helped their community build a new synagogue building (see below for the picture) and has assisted his community in affording its celebrations of the Jewish holidays.

I don't need to tell you that it's been a rough year to be a Jewish college student. That's why nearly another thousand dollars made its way to Hillels of Georgia this year. Hillel has been on the front lines in our community's fight against anti-Semitism and in providing a safe, loving environment for our college students.

Most importantly, but not surprisingly, a good portion of our dollars and quarters have been sent to Israel. When the war broke out in October, nearly 1300 dollars were directed to assist in buying gloves, hats, snacks, and other supplies for Yariv Lis' (a preschool and religious school dad) unit in the IDF. An additional \$500 went to Masorti Israel, which supports Israeli conservative synagogues, and another \$180 made its way to the Schechter Institute, which supports training rabbis and educators; both of these tzedakot have taken financial hits as donations to Israel largely have been diverted this year to causes directly involved with the war effort.

Locally, we also made some smaller, but also meaningful contributions. \$180 went to help support our team, led by Bob Frohlich in Atlanta's Hunger Walk. It may also surprise you that we wrote a check for \$180 to Dressler's funeral care. Why? Because periodically, there are Jews in our area who die alone with no family, and we must do our part to help assist in the mitzvah of leviyat hamet, burying the dead.

All in all, your dollars and quarters added up to over \$4500 that we donated to important causes. All of this came from what is inside your pockets. It is a reminder of the old adage that remains true: that even our spare pocket change can help to make the world a better place.

June is Pride Month, and as a father of a non-binary child, who just married their partner, I am reminded of the fact that Love is Love and that we should not ever forget that. Lori and I wish them many years of joy and happiness.

Growing up outside of New Haven, CT meant we spent quite a bit of time by the Long Island Sound. It wasn't the full Atlantic Ocean, but it was close enough to drive to, even for an evening stroll. As with many coastal areas, much of the shoreline was dotted with marinas, both for leisure and commercial purposes, with fishing trawlers and every shape and size sail and powerboat you can imagine. I had never seen myself as a boater, although I loved to go out on them, especially sailboats like the one my father's friend owned in Hauppauge, NY. A trip down the river to New York Harbor one summer weekend when I was a kid, and I was sold. Many years later, when I was in college, my dad and I bought a boat.

It wasn't a new boat – I did have college to pay for – but it was ours. We were the proud new owners of a 1979 O'Day 28, previously owned by another Jewish family in the community. We should have been concerned with the name when we bought it, Tsores II (Yiddish for "Trouble"), but we went ahead anyway and sailed it to its new home in Branford, CT. We decided to re-name it to make it our own and chose a name that really fits the love/hate relationship one has with owning a boat. We called it "Serenity Now". The name comes from the Seinfeld episode where Jerry's father was attempting to manage stress by saying "Serenity Now" repeatedly. However, in the way that you would expect from him, the words did not match the tone in which he yelled them at the top of his lungs. How fitting for a sailboat – which can be both frustrating to manage and maintain but provides some of the most peaceful experiences one can imagine.

I have some great memories of the few summers we had her and even wrote a poem about the first time we set out to sea. It was my weekend apartment during the summers when it was in the water, and it was a great place to hang out with friends. Of course we did actually sail it, and I can say I only got it caught up on one small sandbar, something I do not recommend. In the end, when I got married and it was time to sell and start saving for a house, we parted ways with some pretty amazing memories.

I mentioned I wrote a poem about it, and I'd like to share that with all of you here. I wish you all a safe and meaningful summer, and don't forget to come to Minyan when you are around!

"Serenity Now"

The motor droned and we were underway, Our vessels first journey out was today. However old her hull may be, She's now ready for a new captain, me.

Out through the channel and into the Sound, There weren't too many others around. The winds were quite strong, and the seas seemed rough, But we knew that this first trip might be tough.

Approaching Duck Island, the sea calmed down, And presented itself as Long Island Sound. The time was right, to raise the sails, So off went the engine, and silence prevailed.

We hoisted the mainsail while maintaining our course, And looked to the windex to tell the wind's source. Unfurling the headsail I steered her upwind, And the sails billowed out – now the real fun begins.

We sailed past Duck Island and practiced our tacks, The seas remained calm, and we tried to relax. As we rounded the island, more boats did appear, This day turned out fine, and diminished our fears.

Yom HaShoah Commemoration—Yep, It Was Us in the Big White Bus!

Twenty-two members of both Etz Chaim and the Catholic Church of St. Ann filed into the bus that had been rented through the generosity of Etz Chaim's Men's Club, Rabbi Dorsch, and an anonymous benefactor. The purpose of this joint venture was to attend the 59th anniversary of the Yom HaShoah Memorial on May 5 at Greenwood Cemetery.

The drive to Greenwood Cemetery provided an opportunity for Michael Weinroth, Barry Riesenberg, and Steve Dix to explain the meaning and purpose of Yom HaShoah. Fortunately, at Greenwood there were enough seats for almost everyone, though it was reported in the Atlanta Jewish Times that this year's attendance drew more than 500 people.

Some of the information shared with the group on the bus was that Atlanta area **survivors** paid for the construction of the memorial in 1965, and it is now listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The memorial's architect was Holocaust survivor Ben Hirsch of blessed memory. Hirsch came to Atlanta as a child from Frankfurt, Germany, having lost both of his parents. He was enrolled in an Atlanta public school, unable to speak English. He went on to graduate from Georgia Tech's School of Architecture. During Mr. Hirsch's career he designed many of Atlanta's well-known churches and synagogues, including Congregation Etz Chaim.

On the way back to Etz Chaim there were questions from our St. Ann's friends about the symbolism of placing a Stone of Remembrance inside the interior of the memorial and the purpose of giving each person in attendance a yellow yahrzeit candle that had been furnished by Etz Chaim's Men's Club. When the ceremony concluded, an announcement was made that the white bus was "waiting for Etz Chaim members at the bottom of the hill." Following the memorial event, several families from St. Ann's wrote letters of thanks for including them in this annual event. Please see one example below.



First, I want to say that the invitation from Congregation Etz Chaim to St. Ann's members to join you for Yom HaShoah was very generous. We are so glad we took the opportunity.

The event was beautiful and impactful. It was an honor to be present in some way to our Jewish community. The reverence,

the stories, the children, the songs, the prayers, the warmth and love there, all gave us a sense of an eternal connection and appreciation for WHO you are as a people, and to stand in some small way beside you at yom Hashoah was a privilege.

To date we have sent four donations totaling \$2,142.

How we have supported Israel during this fiscal year:

- Since October 7, 2023, our congregation has stepped up to partner with many different organizations to support in Israel in its time of need.
- Etz Chaim Young Adults participated in JNF's (Jewish National Fund) Israel Resistance Campaign and raised over \$2,268, which was matched by an anonymous donor from JNF.
- Etz Chaim's Department of Education partnered with JNF and raised \$2,000 for the Tu B'Shevat Tree Sale for Israel.
- Our congregation is currently raising funds for JNF's Bomb Shelter Beautification Project. The project cost is \$10,000 to create a mural for the exterior of a shelter from Etz Chaim. We've currently raised \$3,150 and we are looking to raise the full amount of \$10,000. Please continue to donate for this meaningful effort.
- Our Emergency Appeal for Israel Bonds this fiscal year generated over \$848,000 in investments.
- Rabbi Dorsch delivered the items donated by congregants including clothes, socks, cards, etc., at the Military weigh station outside of our sister city, Yokneam. (See photo below)
- Our students in Kitah Zayin, 7th Grade, got creative and made bracelets to sell to our community as their Mitzvah project. They donated \$300 to America Friends of Magen David Adom and another \$600 to the Israel Emergency Fund through Jewish Federation of Greater Atlanta.



Did you know that Congregation Etz Chaim is the only progressive shul in East Cobb that offers daily morning and evening minyans?

Why is minyan so important? In Jewish tradition, the concept of minyan holds profound significance, serving as the cornerstone of communal prayer and spiritual connection. The practice of at least ten Jews coming together for minyan encapsulates the values of solidarity, continuity, and devotion, fostering a sense of belonging and shared purpose that Etz Chaim is known for.

Minyan can mark moments of simcha - like celebrating a b'nai mitzvah, a bris, or naming a baby. During moments of sorrow, such as mourning or illness, the minyan provides solace and strength through collective prayer and consolation. Within the Etz Chaim community, attending minyan transcends mere religious obligation; it embodies the essence of unity, support, and collective devotion to our members who are saying Kaddish after the death of a beloved family member. In this way, attending minyan fosters a culture of compassion, empathy, and mutual care within the Etz Chaim community, ensuring that no member ever feels alone in their journey.

We know that committing to minyan can be tough - it adds another "thing" to your long list of daily tasks. But if you commit to just one minyan a month, you will be performing a mitzvah of the highest order. Bring a friend, bring your kids, go out to dinner afterward, or spend some time catching up in the chapel.




